About The Full Monty

Based on the hit film of the same name, *The Full Monty* follows the fortunes of six unemployed steelworkers in Buffalo, New York. With no job, money or prospects, they are fed up. When the men spy their wives and other local women going crazy over a group of male strippers, an idea begins to emerge. Overcoming their jealousy and feelings of emasculation, they decide to make some quick cash by forming their own act--a team of male strippers with 'real man' bodies. However, their rehearsals are not easy. As they prepare for the performance of their lives, they are tested and exposed, both physically and emotionally. Overcoming their fears, self-consciousness, and inner demons, the men realize that they are strong together and find solace in their friendship. This gives them the courage to finally 'let it go' and reveal all!

Who we are looking for

- The Kings Theatre is committed to ensuring that casting reflects the diversity of our community, and we are looking for performers from all backgrounds, genders, and ethnicities.
- Adults are aged 18+ on audition day.
- Please be aware there will be nudity

Registration

- The closing date for compulsory audition registration is end of day, Sunday 13th April 2025.
- The Kings Theatre reserves the right to close applications early if audition numbers exceed available audition spaces.
- You must register via the Kings website. No other way of registering will be accepted.
- You will then be contacted with details of the venue and time for auditions.

Audition day information

- Auditions will be on Sunday 27th April 2025.
- On the day you will be informed if you have been recalled.
- Please note anyone who arrives late will not be able to join the audition as this will disrupt the other auditionees.

• Please be prepared to stay all day as recalls will be held for those selected from the first round of auditions. If this is the case, you will be informed of what time to return for the recall.

What to expect on Audition Day

Audition, Round One:

- For the first round you will be taught a piece of choreography during the session which you will be asked to perform.
- If you are successful in this first round, you will be asked to attend a recall later in the day.

In addition to Estelle, Susan and Joanie, there are more friends of Georgie and there are a few group scenes scattered throughout the show. We also have the smaller roles below, which we will cast but not audition for.

Molly Macgregor	Malcolm's Mother. Has a few speaking lines. Must be able to be carried or ok in a wheelchair.
Dance Instructor	Hosts the local dance school – one scene.
Georgie's Mates x 6	Loud, jovial, gum chewing. Appear as the Men's fantasy in a scene in black & red lace & leather.

Gentlemen:

At least 6 - 10 men. In most cases, each man would take at least 1, 2 or 3 of the parts below, which are small but vital to the show. These parts will not be auditioned but do please let us know if you are interested in any particular role.

Teddy Slaughter	Pam's live-in boyfriend. Smart. Small role with lines in 2 or 3 scenes.
Buddy "Keno" Walsh	Professional stripper – must be in shape. Has to strip to his underwear but not naked. Speaking role. Confident.

Reg Willoughby	Tends to act as foreman for the mill workers. Small speaking role.
Tony Giordano	A club owner – small speaking role in a scene or two.
Police x 2	Small roles in one scene.
Minister	Small cameo role in one scene. Conducts a funeral.
